**RELEASE, ASSUMPTION OF RISK, AND**  
**WAIVER OF LIABILITY AGREEMENT**

I acknowledge that the San Mateo County Mounted Patrol, Inc. has not made, and does not make any representations of warranty of any kind, expressed or implied, in connection with my presence here or my use of this facility.

I acknowledge that my activities on this premises are potentially dangerous and involve the risks of serious injury and damage to both person and property, including the risk of death. In consideration of the permission to use any or all of the Mounted Patrol facilities, I expressly assume all risks associated with my activities and presence here, including, but not limited to, all risks incidental to traveling to or from the Mounted Patrol premises. This assumption of risk includes the risk of injury to myself, members of my family and damage to my horse or other property, whether or not the same is caused or related to the negligence of the San Mateo County Mounted Patrol, Inc., its members, guests, employees, officers and directors, or anyone connected in any way to the Woodside Roundup.

I warrant that I am insured against the perils involved in the herein described activities. I have read and fully understand this Release, Assumption of Risk and Waiver of Liability Agreement, and have voluntarily executed the same, and I understand and agree that it is intended to be as broad as, and as inclusive as, is permitted by California law and if any portion hereof is held invalid, the balance shall continue in full force and effect.

## Event Rules and Restrictions

**LOCAL TEAM ROPING:** A person may enter a maximum of two (2) times. The local team roping will be chute run. To be eligible to enter the local team roping, both participants must live in San Mateo, San Francisco or Santa Clara County. The participants must submit verification of address upon request. Two (2) loops. Sixty (60) second time limit. Ropers will start in the roping boxes, however the header may not dally until the steer crosses a barrel line in the arena. Doing so shall result in a ten (10) second penalty.

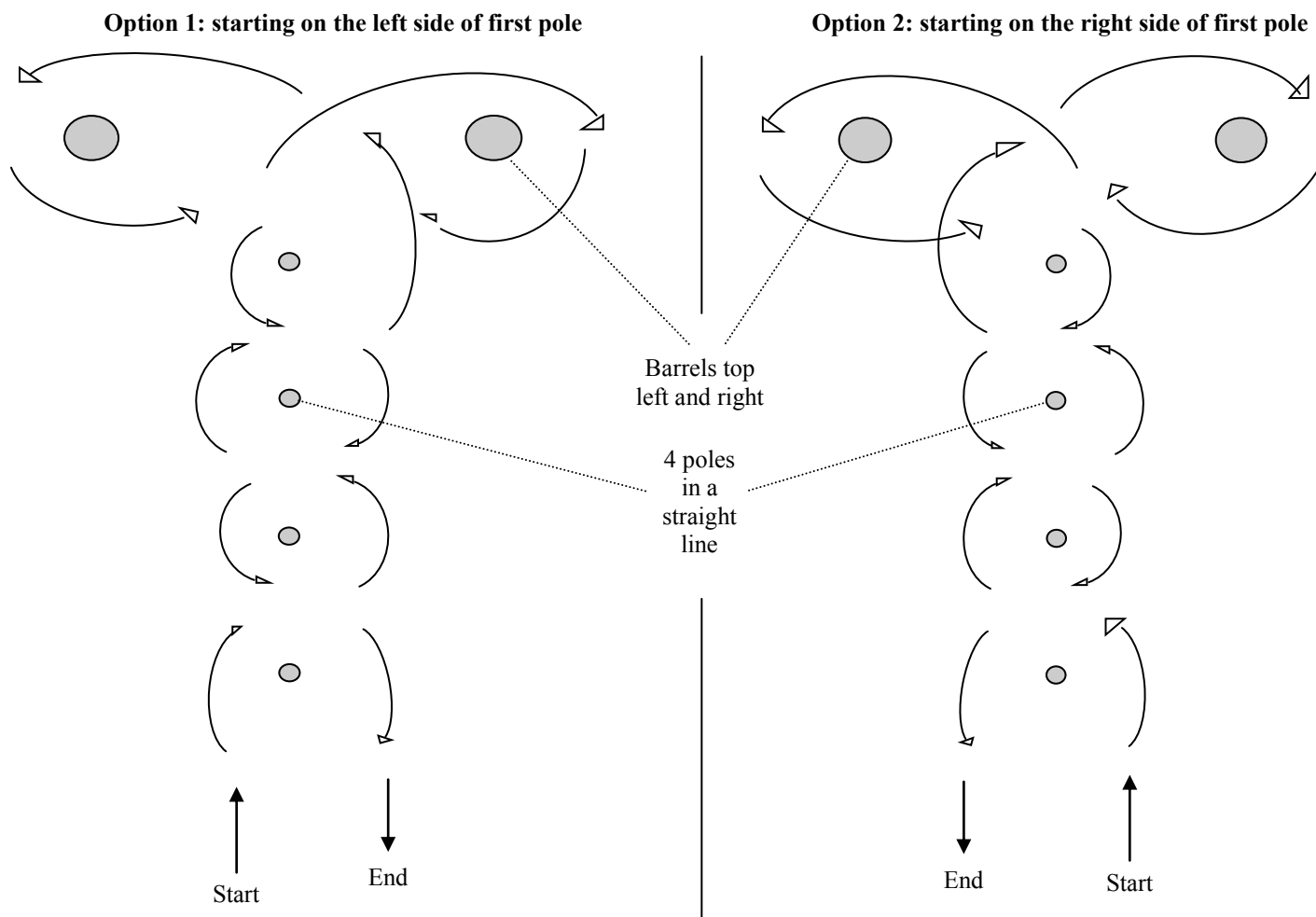
**DOUBLE MUGGING:** Two-person team, consisting of one mounted roper and one mugger on the ground. Roper will start from behind a starting line. Roper will rope the steer around the head, neck and/or front leg. The mugger may leave with the head horse and must then mug the steer to the ground without tripping him via aid from the roper's rope. The roper then dismounts and ties any three legs. Time will stop when the roper throws his hands in the air. The cow must be down for six (6) seconds after both team members have cleared the cow.

**MIXED RIBBON ROPING:** Two (2) person team, consisting of one man and one woman. Roper will come from the header's box. Runner starts from behind the designated line in the heeler's box and cannot leave until the steer clears the chute. The roper heads the steer and must wait to dally until he crosses the barrel line. Meanwhile the runner pulls any piece of ribbon off of the steer's tail and runs back across the starting line to stop time. One (1) loop maximum. Only legal head catches allowed, except the head catch may include a front leg. One (1) minute time limit. Roper may not run back into the roping box.

**RANCH STYLE STEER STOPPING:** The header will start behind a starting line in the arena and will run towards the released steer. When the steer crosses the line, time will start. Time will be stopped when the roper has dallied, the horse is facing and both horse and steer are on all four feet. Jerking the steer over backwards is an automatic disqualification. Only legal head catches allowed, except the head catch may include a front leg. One (1) loop. Thirty (30) second time limit.

**DRAW TEAM BRANDING:** Rodeo secretary will draw four-man (4-man) teams. Two team members will rope while two will be ground crew. After animal is roped it must be stretched by both front and both hind feet. Both ropers must be dallied and tight before the brand may leave the paint bucket. Animals must be branded in the correct place on the correct side with the brand correct-side up. After one animal is branded the ground crew will rope and the ropers will act as ground crew to brand the second and last calf. Any unnecessary roughness, including running cattle into the fence, will result in disqualification. Horned cattle may be used. Four (4) minute time limit.

**BIG "T" RACE:** Time will start when the mounted contestant crosses the starting line. He will weave through four (4) poles, making sure to go around the last pole, and then turn two (2) barrels and weave back through the four (4) poles still making sure to go around the first pole. Time stops when they cross back over the starting line. See diagram below. Contestant may choose to start either on the right or the left as long as he correctly completes the course. A knocked down barrel or pole will result in a five (5) second penalty.

## More Event Rules and Restrictions

**TEAM DOCTORING:** Three (3) person team where all of the contestants start mounted. Each contestant has one loop to try to rope. Between the three (3) contestants the animal must be roped by the head and the heels. After both ropers dally and come tight, the third teammate will dismount, knock the calf down and replace the ropes so that animal is stretched by both front and both hind legs. He will then mark the animal's ribs with the provided crayon. Time will stop when he throws his hands clear of the animal. Only legal head catches allowed, except the head catch may include a front leg. Two (2) minute time limit.

**OPEN STEER RIDING:** Time to start when the inside front shoulder of the steer crosses the plane of the chute. Steer to be ridden one-handed for eight (8) seconds. Two judges will each award half of the points to the rider and half to the animal. Touching the animal with your free hand is a disqualification.

**HIDE RACE:** Two (2) person team. The mounted rider will cross the starting line already dallied to his hide. Time starts when the rider crosses the starting line. He will run towards the other end of the arena where his partner will be waiting on foot. When the roper crosses the barrel line, his partner will mount the hide and get drug back across the starting line. Falling off results in a disqualification. Thirty (30) second time limit.

**OPEN TEAM BRANDING:** Four-man (4-man) teams of contestants' choosing. The rules are the same as the Draw Team Branding, except that there will be four (4) animals to brand, wherein each man must rope twice and be ground crew twice.

**TEAM PENNING:** Three (3) man team will pen three (3) cattle out of a herd of thirty (30) head. No more than four (4) cattle may cross the start line. Any dirty cattle must be run back to the correct side of the line before penning. One team member must ride into the pen and raise their hand to call for time. No ropes will be allowed. No unnecessary roughness. Two (2) minute time limit. Teams may enter only once. Individuals may enter two (2) times.

**SPONSOR CALF DRESSING:** Three (3) man team. The animals will be haltered and turned loose into the arena. The team must catch an animal and dress it by putting both hind legs through the appropriate shirt sleeves in the provided shirt and pull the shirt over its back. Time will stop when everyone clears the animal. The shirt must be on for six (6) seconds after the time stops

**ALL AROUND:** The All-Around champion will be determined by the contestant who accumulated the most points over both days. Points will be awarded as follows: Six (6) points for first (1st) place, five (5) points for second (2nd) place, four (4) points for third (3rd) place, and so on until sixth (6th) place receives one point. Contestants must enter at least three (3) events to be eligible to be the all-around champion. Local Team Roping will not count towards the All-Around. Tie to be broken by money won. A saddle will be awarded to first overall.

**LATE ENTIRES:** Late entries will be taken at the discretion of the rodeo secretary based upon availability of stock. Late entrants must pay in cash and include a fifty dollar (\$50) per person late fee. Late entrants should expect to take the first run on the stock in slack.

## General Rules and Restrictions

RODEO BEGINS SATURDAY, AUGUST 21ST AT 7AM. IF NECESSARY, WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO RUN FRIDAY SLACK AT 12 NOON.

Draw will be posted the Wednesday before the rodeo at [www.rvstables.com](http://www.rvstables.com). No refunds are given after the draw is posted.

Any contestant caught breaking the following rules may be subject to a warning or a disqualification, as per the judge's discretion.

Contestants will be held responsible for the other non-contestant members of their party.

The judge's decision is final.

No firearms allowed on the premises.

No smoking, alcohol or glass allowed in or around the arenas.

Contestants must park in the designated contestant parking areas and keep all areas clean from trash and other debris.

DRESS CODE WILL BE ENFORCED - i.e. cowboy hat, long-sleeved collar and cuff shirt (may not be rolled up and NO long-sleeved tee shirts will be allowed), western jeans (no large tears) and boots when in the rodeo arena.

All contestants must conduct themselves in a professional manner at all times.

Absolutely NO abusive treatment towards an animal will be tolerated, regardless of ownership. Any contestant caught abusing any animal will be IMMEDIATELY disqualified and forfeit any entry fees and/or monies won.

Failure to follow these rules may result in disqualification and forfeiture of entry fees.
